Profile of the Respondents to the 2024 Survey



- 1079 people responded to the CHNA survey compared to 723 in 2022, 1200 in 2019 and 1110 in 2016. Not all respondents answered every question.
- The respondents who identified as residents represent about 1.7% of the county population based on 2023 Census estimates.
- 95.3% of respondents identified as white; 98.08% as non- Hispanic. This mirrors the county Census estimates.
- 64.39% of respondents were women though male/ female ratios in the county are roughly 50/50.


Respondents Based on Age, 2024


Between 2022 to 2023, According to the U.S Census, the population composition has changed:

- The age group 0 to 18 has been decreasing.
- The age group 18 to 65 has been decreasing.
- The age group 65+ has been increasing.

This will have serious impact on the demand for health services for the aged and an impact on Social Security stability as the pool of the employed shrinks.

Age Distribution, 2021 and 2023 Estimates Hillsdale and Michigan





Annual Jobless Rates, Hillsdale & Michigan, 2009 to 2022





Average Wage by Education Type for Male and Females in Michigan, 2022





Marital Status by Percent, Males & Females, Hillsdale & Michigan, 2023





9% of respondents to the survey has less than a high school diploma.



Only 9.5% of county residents aged 25 or less did not have a high school diploma per the U.S. census data estimates for 2023.

Some Conclusions

64.4% of our survey respondents were female compared to 49.9% in the general population. In the 2019 CHNA Survey, 75% of survey respondents were female.

Respondents who identified as county residents represented about 1.7% of the population based on 2023 Census estimates.


95.3% identified as white; 98.1% as non-Hispanic.

23.1% of our survey respondents were age 65 or over, compared to 19.2% in the general population. 9.4% of all Hillsdale residents do not have a high school diploma compared to 9.5% in the general population. No questions were asked about income, but According to the 2023 U.S. Census Data, Hillsdale has a higher percentage of people in poverty (15.5%) compared to MI (13.5%).

- The extent to which county children are on Medicaid could not be determined by this survey because the survey was limited to those age 18 and over.
- Kids Count in Michigan, 2024, reported the number of children on Medicaid in Hillsdale was 52.7% compared to 47.1% in Michigan.

Medicare consists of four parts:

- Part A: Hospital insurance
- Part B: Medical (doctor) coverage
- Part C: Medicare Advantage Plans (optional)
- Part D: Prescription coverage (optional)

Both those age 65+ and the disabled may qualify for Medicare.

In Michigan, 2024:


- 87% on Medicare were aged.
- 13% were disabled.

Some aged and disabled also qualify for Medicaid.



Prenatal Care, 2024-22 Averages



- 47.6% of Hillsdale deliveries in this time were covered by Medicaid compared to 39.2% in Michigan.
- 61.5% of the mothers received adequate prenatal care compared to 68.9% in Michigan.
- 27.2% of mothers received intermediate care compared to 23.0% in Michigan.
- 11.4% had inadequate care compared to 8.1% in Michigan.




Weight Concerns

 - 35.7% of Hillsdale Residents are Obese compared to 34.7% in Michigan.


Smoking Concerns

Percent of Mothers Who Smoke, Three Year Trends, Hillsdale & Michigan




Drinking Patterns, Branch-Hillsdale-St. Joseph & Michigan Residents 2020-22




Number of Opioids Deaths in Michigan






Respondents Visited their Doctors, 2024, 2022 & 2019


Concerns about Doctor Visits?




Respondents Waiting Time to See a Doctor, 2024








Respondents Use of Hospital Services, 2024



Respondents were asked if they had tried Telehealth:

• 152 (18.6%) said they did.

If they had not used Telehealth, they were asked why not:

- 282 (53.7%) said they didn't know it was an option.
- 137 (26%) said it feels too impersonal.
- 60 (11.4%) said they has no computer/ smart phone.
- 50 (9.5%) said they had no internet connection.
- 48 (9.2%) said they have security concerns.




Inpatient Discharges, Psychiatry, Hillsdale Hospital, 2012-2024


Poor Mental Health, Branch- Hillsdale St. Joseph Residents Age 18 or Older Compared to Michigan

Key Takeaways

- Hillsdale County has a higher percentage of residents without a high school diploma compared to Michigan.
- More Hillsdale County residents are uninsured compared to the national average.
- Hillsdale County has a higher percentage of people in poverty than Michigan and the U.S.
- Most employment in the county is in blue-collar jobs, potentially due to a lack of education or white-collar job opportunities.
- In 2024, more respondents had to choose between food/utilities and prescriptions due to cost.
- One in five women who give birth in Hillsdale County lack a high school diploma, compared to one in ten in Michigan.
- Many mothers in the county are not receiving adequate prenatal care.
- The smoking rate among mothers in Hillsdale County is double the Michigan average.
- The number of respondents who visited their doctor only once or twice decreased by 2.6% since 2022, with 13% possibly not visiting a doctor at all.
- Forty-one percent of respondents are waiting over 2-3 weeks to see a specialist.
- Only 32.4% of Hillsdale residents complete Pap tests, compared to 54.6% statewide in Michigan.
